

Multicultural Coexistence in Iga city

Foreign population on the rise in recent years

The foreign population of Iga City decreased slightly from 2009 to 2014 due to the effects of the Lehman Brothers bankruptcy, etc., but then started to increase, reaching a record high of 5715 in 2019, and 5361 as of 2021. While the total population decreased by 14.2% over the 15 years from 2006 to 2021, the foreign population increased by 8.9%.

The percentage of the foreign population to the total population is 6.1%, the second highest among the cities and towns in Mie prefecture.



Trends in the total foreign population and its percentage of the total population



Increasing multinationalization

As of 2021, the number of foreign nationalities residing in the city is 44. By nationality, Brazil accounted for about 40% of the foreign population as of 2021, although the number is declining. On the other hand, Vietnam has seen a significant increase in recent years, accounting for about 20% of the total, approximately 16 times more than in 2006.

A comparison of the proportion of the population by nationality between 2006 and 2021 shows an increase in South-East Asian countries.

Percentage of population by nationality (Basic Resident Register, end-December 2021)




Purpose of plan formulation and planning period

The city has been working towards the creation of a community that is not divided by nationality as well as gender, age and place of residence, based on the Iga City Basic Self-Government Ordinance and in accordance with the Comprehensive Plan and the Comprehensive Plan for Human Rights Policies. However, with the increase in the number of foreign residents and their permanent residence, new issues have arisen, such as an increase in the number of children born in Japan who are connected to foreign countries, and how to deal with the aging population. Against the background of these circumstances and changes in social conditions, the Iga City Multicultural Guideline was formulated in August 2021 in order to work 'All Iga City ' towards the realization of a 'Sustainable Iga City where no one is left behind'. This plan is formulated to share the image of "Iga City's ideal multicultural coexistence" shown in this guideline, and to systematically promote initiatives from each standpoint toward the same goal.

We aim to make Iga City a place where all people can feel comfortable living, by establishing an equal relationship with Japanese residents, participating in town planning together, and preventing foreign residents from suffering social disadvantages.

At the same time, we aim to create new value for Iga City that transcends existing values by collaborating with various entities and building face-to-face relationships.



This plan sets the target achievement period to 2030, and the planning period (Phase 1) for specific initiatives is from 2023 to 2026.


Basic concept of the plan

(Basic principle)

Realization of a society that is able to accept each other's cultural backgrounds and diversity, feel the comfort of living, and creates new values together.

(Basic policy and direction of development measure)

Based on the four basic policies, in order to promote measures effectively and efficiently, we will promote regional development of multicultural coexistence based on the four "Directions of development measure" from the next page.



Development of measures

Direction of development 1

Creating a safe and secure community for everyone

(Future vision of All Iga City)

- ♦ Building face-to-face relationships on a daily basis, everyone has a place to be accepted as a member of the local community and play an active role in the event of a disaster etc.
- ♦ There are opportunities to learn about the welfare system and customs of Japanese society, in addition, there is a range of consultation and information services that can be easily accessed.
- ♦ A system is in place to ensure that people who need support are not left behind and receive the support they need through communities and networks.

Building a community that is easy to educate and raise children

(Future vision of All Iga City)

- ♦ Japanese language education is provided according to the child's stage of development, and seamless support is carried out in cooperation with schools, local communities and organizations.
- ♦ Children have a sense of identity and self-esteem, and an environment and social acceptance system that allows them to choose their future, including higher education, is in place.
- ♦ The working environment for parents in child-rearing households has improved, and there are systems, exchanges and learning opportunities to discuss child-rearing concerns regardless of nationality and cultural differences.

Creating communities where foreign residents also play an active role.

(Future vision of All Iga City)

- ♦ A system has been put in place to reflect the opinions of people with connections to foreign countries in community development.
- ♦ A system has been established in which all people, including children, the elderly, people with disabilities and foreign residents, can be active in their own way and help each other in the local community.
- ♦ Foreign residents are participating in local activities and volunteer activities through cooperation with NPOs and utilization of private funds, and through the involvement of various entities.

5 Towards 'creating new value'

It is also necessary to understand the role and importance of foreign residents, as there are examples in our city of foreign residents helping each other and foreign residents assisting Japanese residents in their daily lives. By recognizing and communicating these potential attractions, it is possible to curb the population outflow and increase the number of permanent residents, thereby increasing the number of migrants and related populations and realizing a sustainable Iga City.

In addition, the fusion of social innovations, such as the digitalization of society, and the 'new values' generated by multiculturalism may make possible what was thought to be impossible with conventional thinking, or solve long-standing issues in the community.

In order to create 'new values' beyond multiculturalism, the initiatives of the Plan must be taken as a matter of personal concern for each citizen and each entity, and must be coordinated and cooperated with.

Promotion of the 'All Iga City' plan.

In order to work on the promotion of this plan in an 'All Iga City' manner, the project will be promoted by linking it to concrete actions and practices through the cooperation and collaboration of citizens, residents' councils, businesses, various organizations and the administration, with the Multiculturalism Promotion Plan Committee as the core. The following roles are expected in the Plan. We would appreciate your interest in multiculturalism and your understanding and cooperation in doing what you can to help.

(Expected role of each entity.)

Citizens	In order to support the city of Iga together beyond nationality differences, we will develop an interest in and understanding of multiculturalism, as well as a desire to help and look after those close to us.
Residents' Autonomy council	While creating opportunities for exchange and building relationships on a regular basis, accept foreign residents as community leaders and promote community development through cooperation and co-creation.
Enterprises	The project supports foreign workers in balancing work and childcare while creating an environment where they can work and play an active role, as well as providing information and building relationships within the workplace where they can consult with each other.
Various Organizations	The role is to act as a 'bridge' between foreign residents and Japanese residents, for example by coordinating the building of relationships in the community and elsewhere through information dissemination, communication support and learning support.
Administration	It supports the provision of information and the creation of opportunities for exchange, while creating a system of consultation and support for those who need it, in order to build relationships in the community and elsewhere, and to create an environment in which foreign residents can play an active role.
